Christmas Cards and Calendar






Our 2026 Calendar is now available on website and our September from 28th our Christmas cards will also be available on our site shop.

Fireworks

It's coming round to that dreaded time of vear - fireworks!

When my kids were little we used to love going to bonfires where sparklers, catherine

wheels and pretty coloured rainbows were the norm. Now it seems to be all about how loud and how high they can go! There have been several petitions to regulate them but all to no avail and in the meantime our domestic and wild animals continue to suffer.

There are different things on the market to help with this and keep dogs calm, plug ins, collars, thunder jackets, medication, etc., but not all work on different dogs, so its best to test run some before the event(s) not forgetting Christmas, New Year, various weddings etc! We use oils and Quinessence, synergies for sleep or relax, and they do work on a lot of our dogs—it must be synergies as if the dog accepts it then it can be massaged, whereas pure oils cannot go on the skin. To be honest the best thing in most cases is to let the dog find a 'safe place' and bed down for the duration, quite often the more we fuss or worry the more stressed they become (see note 2 in fun facts). Playing music can help and sometimes introducing music that has loud drums or bangs can be introduced some time before with the volume being increased gradually over a period of time. I'm afraid that until new laws ever come into force the best we can is to manage it for out dogs. Keep calm and stay safe.
